

Drunkard's Path Made Simple

Supply List

- Quilter's Paradise Circle Templates set; **OR**
C&T's Fast2Cut Foolproof Circle Templates set (3 1/2" --> 12 1/2" circles)
- Sewing machine with zig-zag or blanket stitch capabilities
(be sure to bring instruction book, power cord and foot control!)
- Assorted sewing machine needles, including Microtex Sharp or Jeans/Denim for piecing
- Quarter-inch piecing foot **AND** open toe appliqué foot (if you have them)
- ANY/ALL other feet for your machine
- Neutral color piecing thread
- Rotary cutter, mat and rulers (one long and another 6" x 12" or larger)
- Travel iron and ironing mat, if you have them
- Basic sewing supplies, including fabric scissors, seam ripper and straight pins
- Fabric
 - Red and Cream wall hanging
Finished size ~ 50 x 50 inches; (64) 5" finished blocks plus (36) border triangles.
I used:
 - 4 yards featherweight fusible interfacing
 - 1/2 yard EACH of 7 red fabrics
 - 1/2 yard EACH of 7 white/cream fabrics
 - 4 yards for backing and binding
 - Superior Threads Monopoly **OR** Sulky Invisible polyester thread
 - Metafil (size 70) sewing machine needle
 - Batik Throw
Finished size ~ 75" x 75"; (100) 6" finished blocks plus 1 1/2" inner border and 6 1/2" outer borders.
I used:
 - 5 yards featherweight fusible interfacing
 - small quantities of **MANY** batiks; allow yourself at least a 15" square of each fabric, which will yield 4 background squares or 4 quarter-circles.
 - NOTE: If you use fat quarters, you will be able to get 4 background squares OR 4 quarter-circles out of one fat quarter, but not both. Also, you will have quite a bit of leftover (waste) fabric. It is more **EFFICIENT** to use yardage cut from selvedge to selvedge, but you will get greater **VARIETY** using fat quarters; your choice!
 - 1/2 yard for inner border
 - 2 1/4 yards for outer border
 - 5 1/2 yards for backing and binding
 - Thread in a matching color to sew around each circle with blanket stitch; you may prefer to use one thread around all circles (black, variegated, metallic???)
