

SUPPLY LIST: GOODBYE OLD SWEATER - HELLO NEW FAVORITE JACKET

1. **several old sweaters** - pull-over or cardigan (I say bring several because you don't always know which one will be best for this project. These can match in colors or be colors that can be cut for color blocking.
2. **fabrics** - Bring several fabrics that match the sweaters or are colors that go with these sweaters. I suggest bring 1 to 1-1/2 yard pieces in weights that are about the same as the sweater weights and in colors that would be pleasing when combined with the sweaters. Also bring some extra fabrics that can be used for trims for finishing.
3. **general sewing supplies** - include seam ripper and a single edge razor blade.
4. **sewing machine and/or serger** - I am hoping it works out so some of you can share machines with each other.

SUPPLY LIST: RIGHT PATTERN - WRONG FABRIC

1. **note pad & pencil**
2. **fabrics** - If you have ONE OR TWO pieces of fabric you have questions about bring them for discussion. Please don't bring your whole stash!
3. **camera** - I don't mind if you want to take some pictures.

SUPPLY LIST: TAKING THE FIRST STEP

1. **pattern** - we will be working with Park Bench Pattern Co. patterns. If you have already purchased one you want to try then bring that. You will also be able to purchase patterns in class.
2. **fabrics** - check yardage on the pattern envelope and bring what is needed.
NOTE: A lot of these pattern designs work well if you want to combine more than one fabric in one garment. If you think this may be a possibility then bring extra fabric for possible trims, facings, front and/or back panels, etc. It never hurts to have choices just in case you change your mind in the middle of the project.
3. **washing fabrics** - If you want to wash the garment after it is made then I strongly suggest you pre-wash the fabric before you come to class. Always test wash a small piece of this fabric before you wash the whole piece so you don't get unwanted surprises. ALSO if you are going to or think you may need to use interfacing in the garment....ALWAYS pre-wash (shrink) this also.
3. **general sewing supplies**
4. **sewing machine** - Also bring a serger if that is the way you want to finish seams.
NOTE: If you don't have a serger you don't need to go out and buy one. There are also other ways to finish seams.
